Why Medical Detection Dogs?

Medical Detection Dogs trains and places specialist Medical Assistance Dogs that alert their owners prior to a medical emergency. These dogs support individuals with complex health conditions who have absolutely no awareness of an impending life-threatening medical event.

World-leading work to investigate other conditions where our dogs can help is conducted by the Charity's second department Bio Detection Dogs.

In conjunction with the NHS Milton Keynes Foundation Trust and top universities our charity is conducting ground breaking research into the potential for dogs to assist clinicians in the early detection and diagnosis of cancers and other serious diseases.

Medical Detection Dog's work is much needed. One in two born after 1960 will be affected by cancer during their lifetime, diabetes is on the rise and the challenges facing the NHS are well known. We are already making a huge difference to many, but we have the potential to save many thousands and utterly transform the future detection of disease by offering a reliable, cost-effective and simple solution to early disease detection.
